## **YMCAs Impact on Communities**

Illinois YMCAs adapted their business model to accommodate unique child care needs during the pandemic, **serving 23,071 youth**.

- 35% of those youth qualified for child care assistance
- 4,638 children served during emergency childcare during the first half of the year to allow essential workers to continue working
- YMCAs provided remote learning assistance, allowing 16,043 school age youth to remain engaged academically while providing meals, physical activity and social-emotional support.
- 2,390 pre-school students were able to continue in their development in a familiar, safe and supportive environment.

**3,262,555 meals** – the majority to children – were provided by Illinois YMCAs in 2020 to help alleviate hunger in their communities.

YMCAs served as **emergency shelters for 457 homeless individuals** and 515 low income residents were provided safe shelter in YMCA residential programs in 2020.

91% of IL YMCAs provided virtual fitness programs to meet physical and mental health needs during the pandemic.

Drowning prevention continues to be a priority issue, and YMCAs provided water safety and swim lessons to 4,736 individuals safely by modifying instruction to accommodate social distancing.
